# Buddha and Christ Buddhism in a Christian Land

## **Course Objective**

Since American society recognizes Christianity as its primary religious affiliation, this course addresses how Buddhism fits into a Christian culture. Explore Buddhist teachings with a Christian perspective with Chaplain/Reverend/Kahu/Sensei Sherman Thompson, who was raised in a Shin Buddhist family and ordained as a United Church of Christ minister and currently serves as a Chaplain at Kamehameha Schools. Compare and contrast the spiritual journeys when living in a multi-cultural, multi-religion society.

## **Course Learning Opportunities**

By the end of the course we will have had the opportunity to:

- Develop an understanding and sense of appreciation for the relationship between Buddhism and Christianity
- Recognize different approaches, definitions and components in the study of Christianity
- Examine the basic beliefs and practices of Christianity.
- Comprehend the historical context for and development of Christianity.

- #3 Scriptures: What do Christians Believe?
  What is the Bible? What are the sources of the Christian faiths?
  How do Christian beliefs affect Christian behavior?
- #4 Christian Churches: What are the various denominations and how do they differ?
